


ON A CLEAR DAY YOU CAN SEE FOREVER . . .

The Great Salt Lake is the largest natural lake in the United States west of the Great Lakes. Distances can be deceiving. The relatively dry climate makes it possible to see for great distances. Looking directly ahead toward the northwest, the point at which the lake seems to disappear over the horizon is about 20 miles away, but the northwest arm of the lake extends another 35 miles or so at normal water levels. The distant Pilot Peak Mountain Range on the far horizon is five miles away.

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På en klar dag kan man se milevidt . . .

The Great Salt Lake er den største naturlige tage i USA vest for de store søer. Afstande kan bedrage. Den relativt tørre klima gør det muligt at se, store afstande. Ser direkte fremad mod nordvest, det punkt, hvor søen synes at forsvinder over horisonten er omkring 20 miles væk, men det nordvestlige arm af søen udvider yderligere 35 miles eller så ved normale vandstand. Den fjerne Pilot Peak Mountain Range i langt horisonten er fem miles væk.
